Subject of the Doctoral Project:

*Probing nuclear parton distribution functions with heavy-quark production*

Thesis supervisors:

The duration of the doctoral project: 3 years

Preparation of the doctoral dissertation will be carried out equally in both institutions.

- Candidate must meet the recruitment conditions applicable in both entities
- The PhD student must know and comply with the regulations in force in both schools



# Agreement -

- **joint education & awarding a doctoral degree.** This agreement must include in particular:
  - the method of implementing cooperation in the field of research and teaching;
  - the exchange of specialist knowledge, know-how, materials;
  - the structure and duration of education;
  - the organization of academic exchange;
  - the preparation of the thesis and final exams;
  - the awarding of doctoral title;
  - management of the training program;
  - costs related to the implementation of the programme;
  - transfer and protection of personal data;
  - management of intellectual property rights.
- administrative regulations and national legislation in both units and the possibility of reconciling them (e.g. requirements for the appointment of a supervisor, duration of training and possibilities for extension, form and scope of the dissertation, form of the thesis defence, requirements for members of the examination committee, etc.).



# Unexpected problem -

## - Polish regulations\*

- no possibility of co-financing international cooperation @ the Doctoral School by Institute

A doctoral student who does not hold a doctoral degree **receives** a doctoral scholarship (max 4 yr).

A doctoral scholarship **may be** funded by funds from a foreign entity, **but** the scholarship **must be** paid by the entity running the doctoral school.

Amendment to the act is announced...

## Let's apply for grants

- Bourse France Excellence: Doktorat cotutelle/codirection -> The scholarships are aimed at those who would like to carry out their doctoral studies in the cotutelle or codirection system simultaneously in France and Poland [Deadline for receipt of applications: 22 April - 8 May 2025.]
